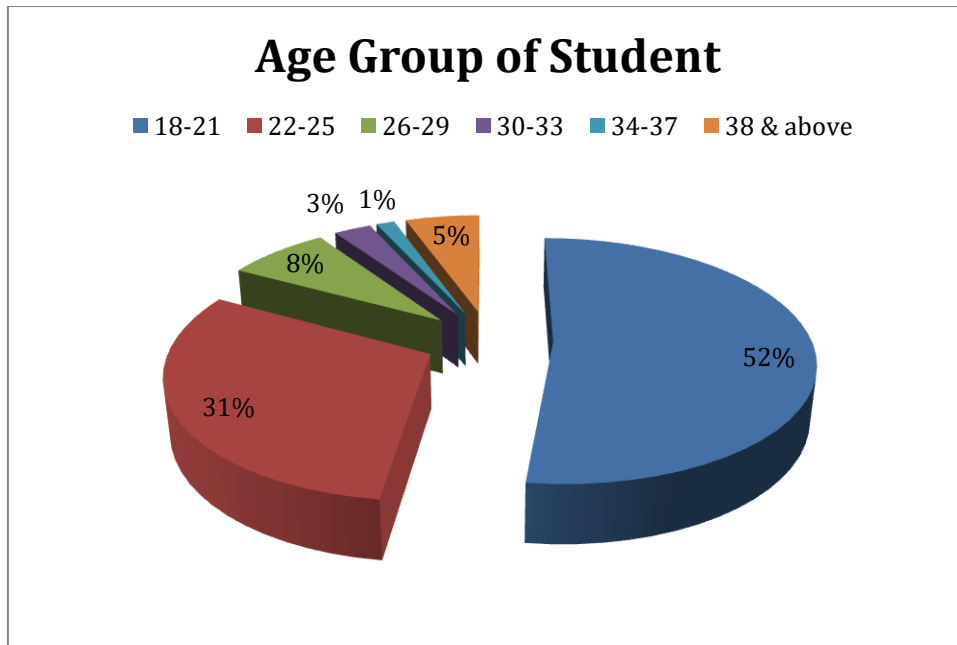

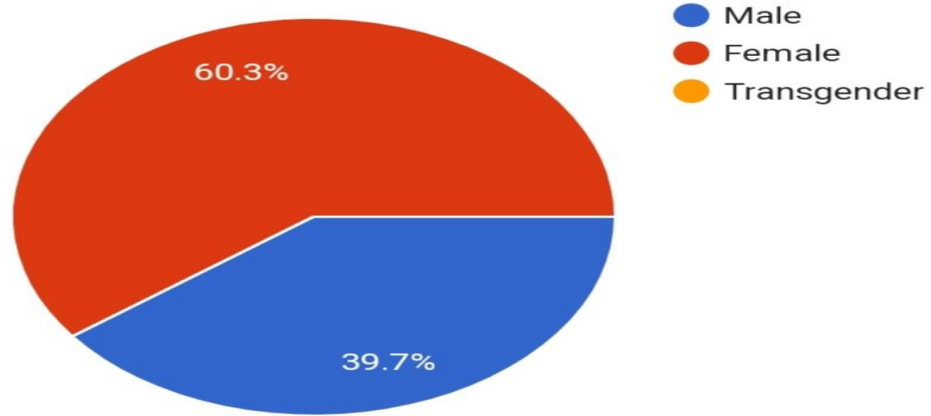

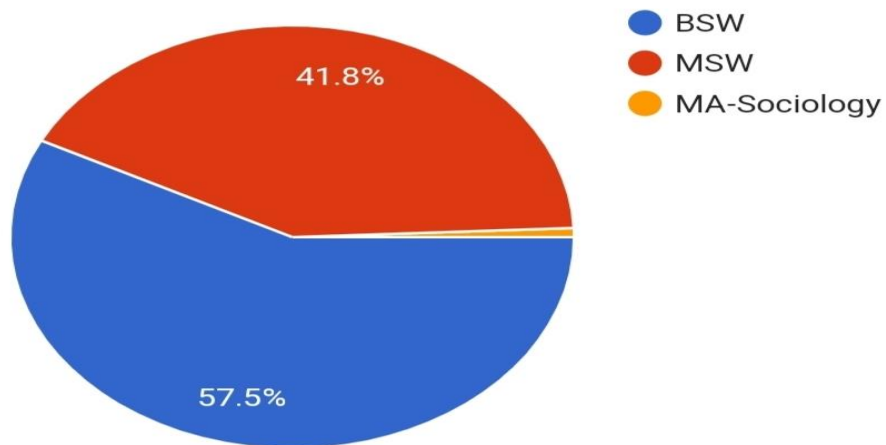

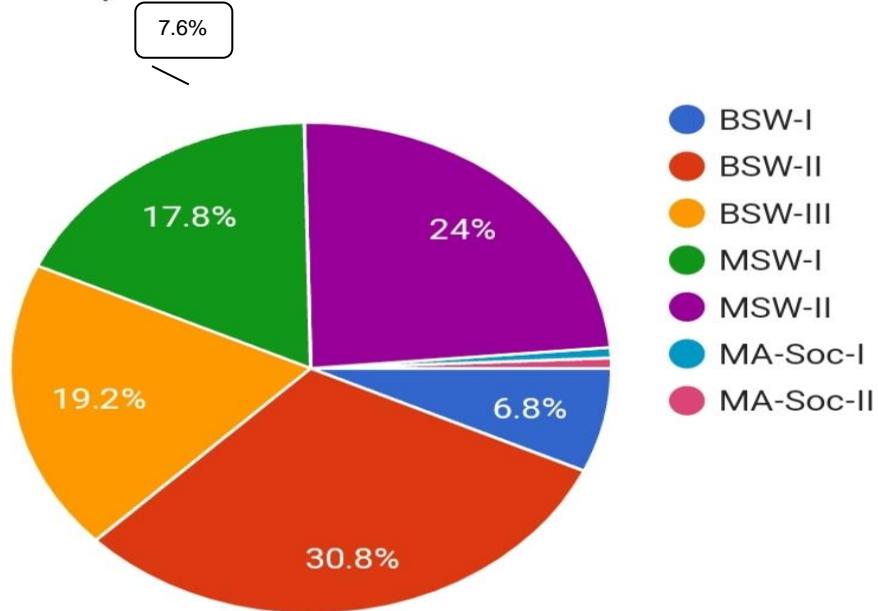

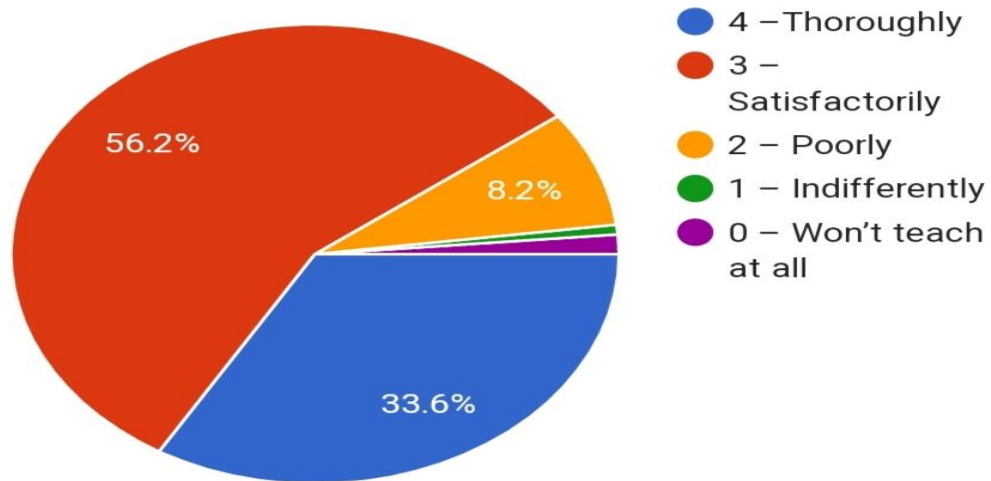
1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?

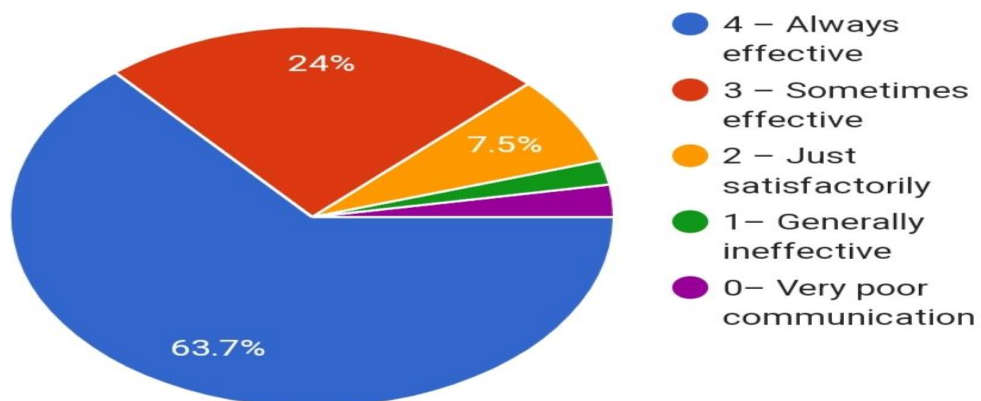

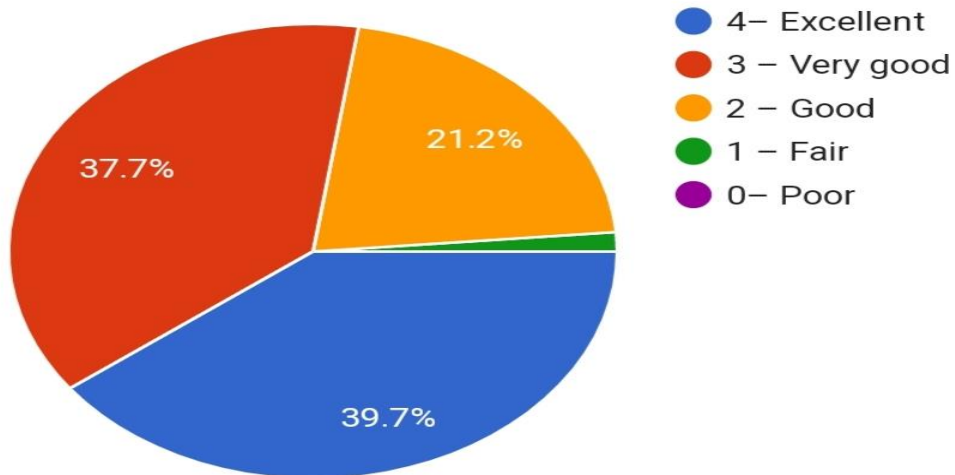

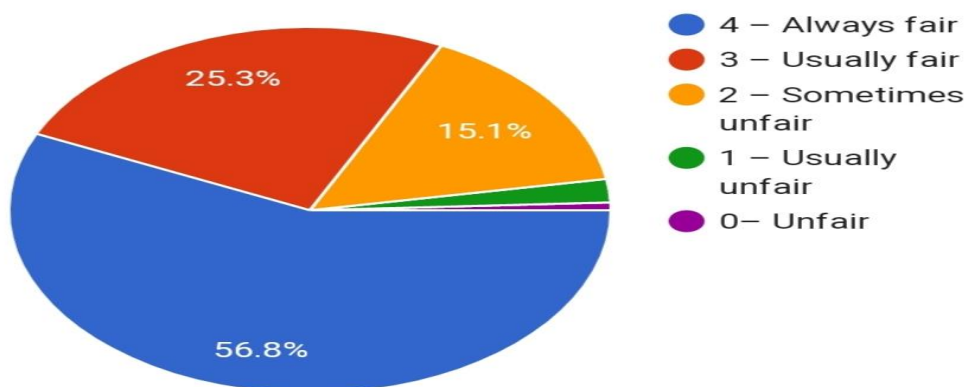
4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as

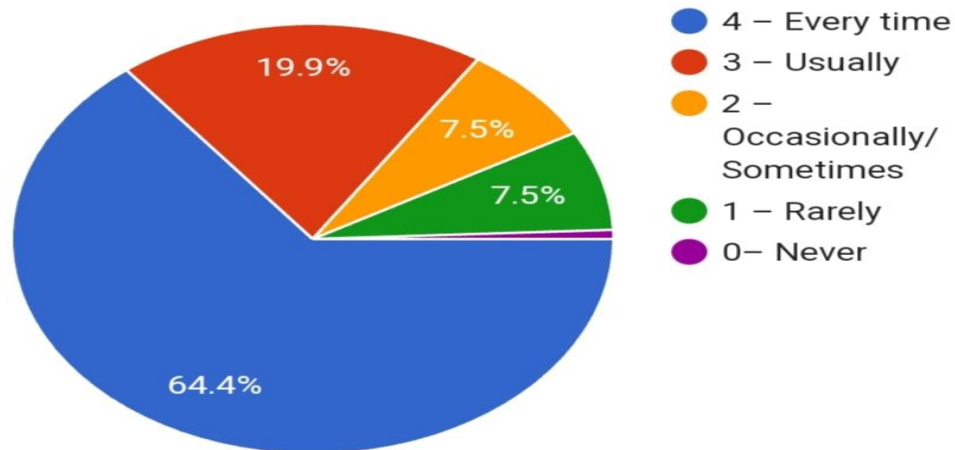

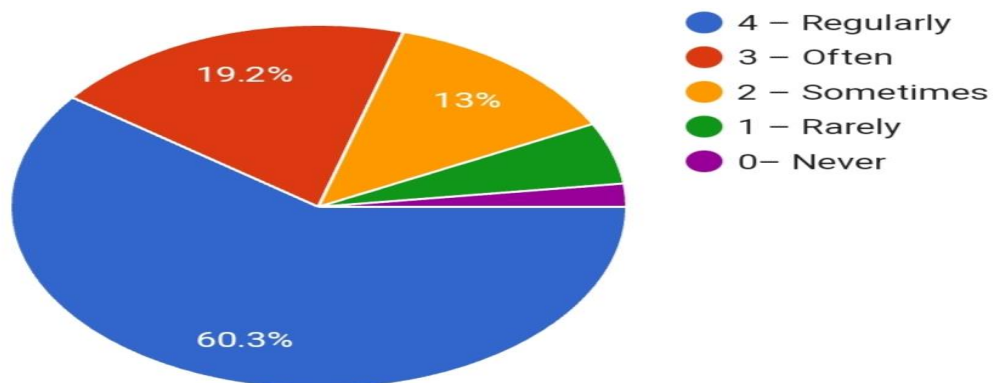

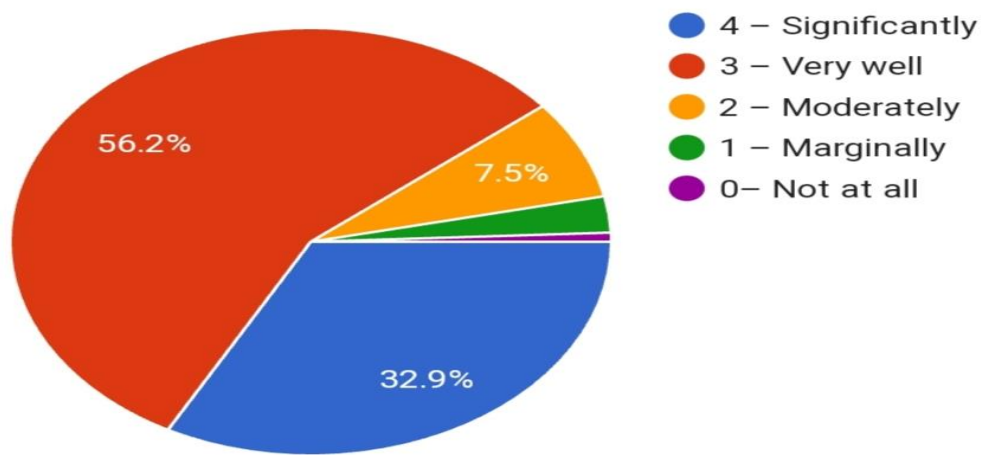

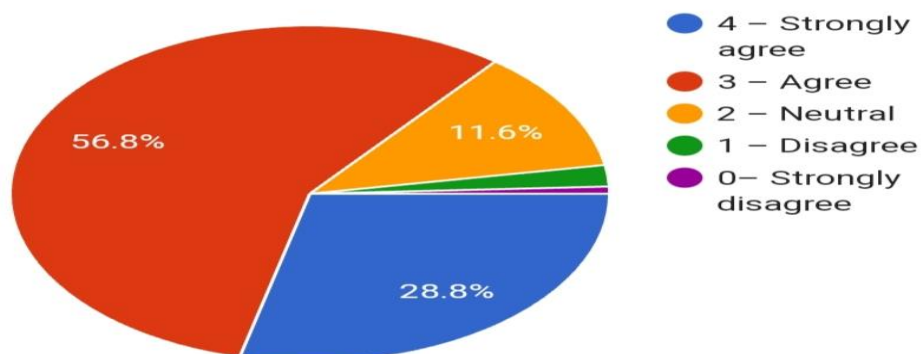

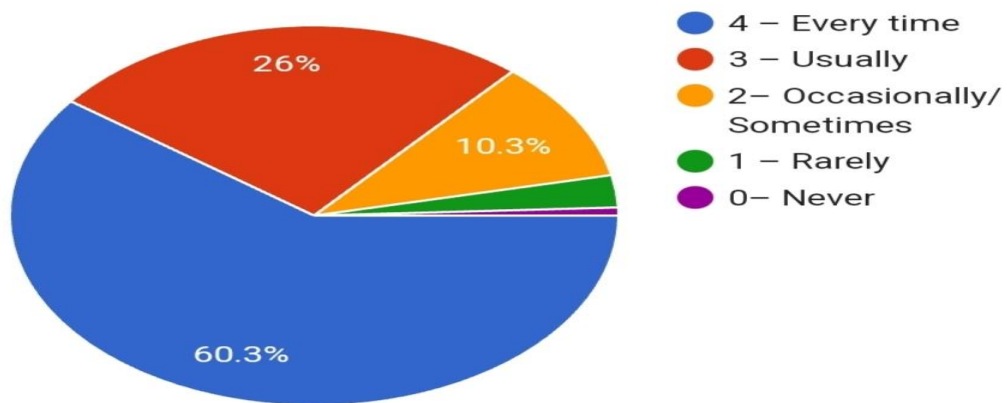

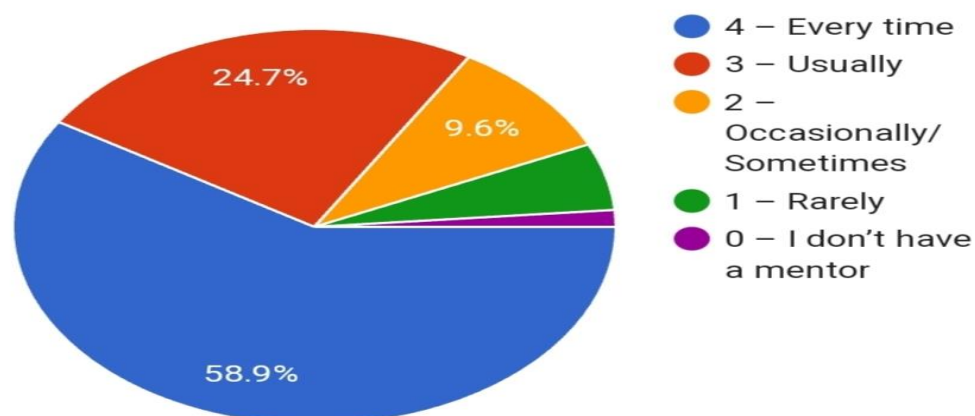

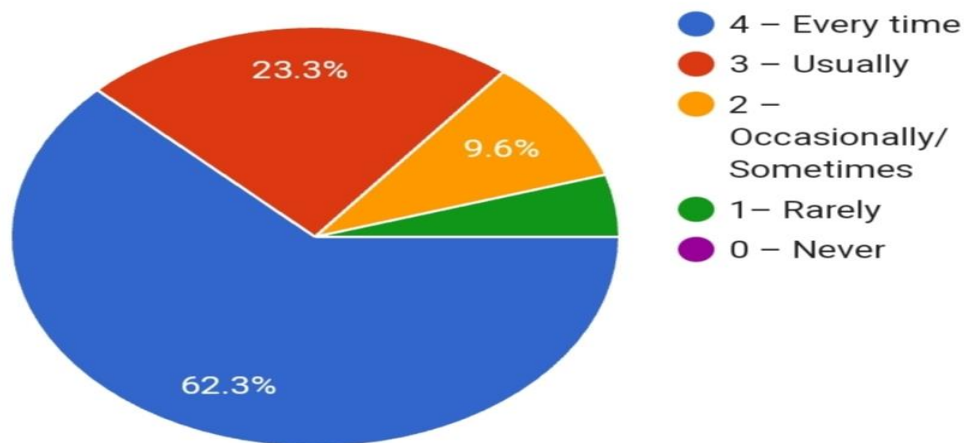

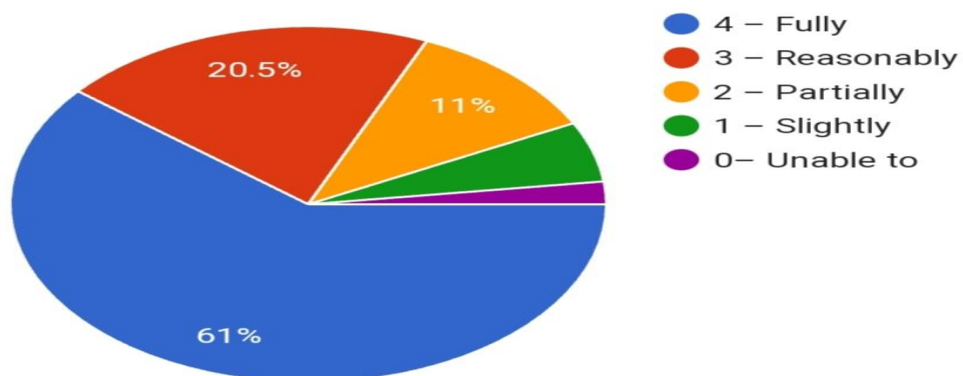

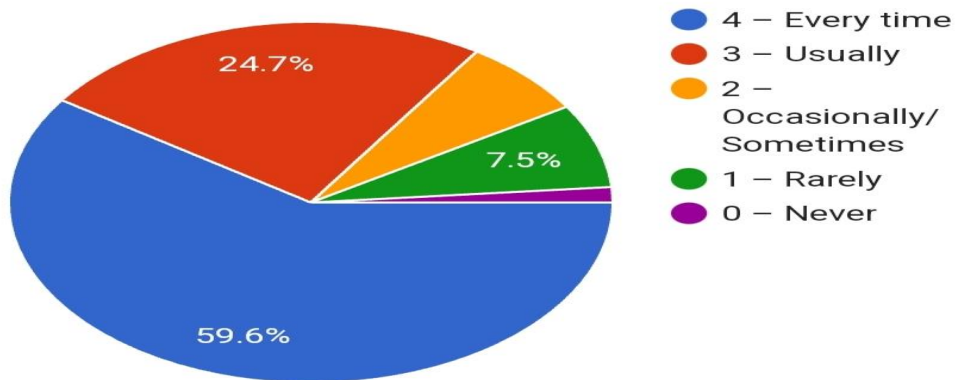

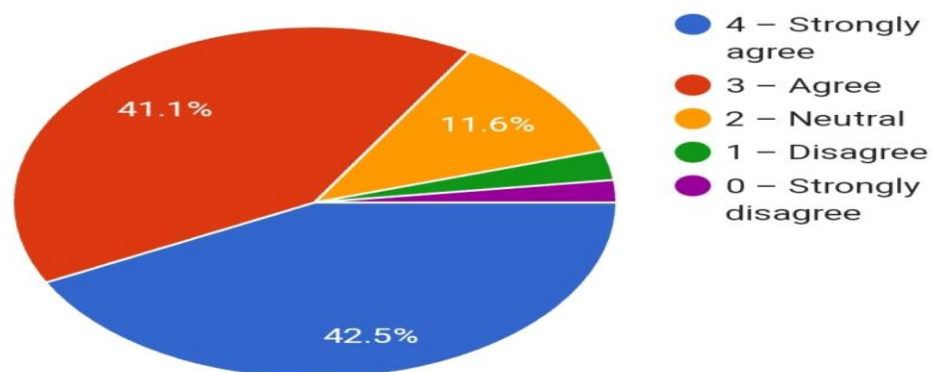

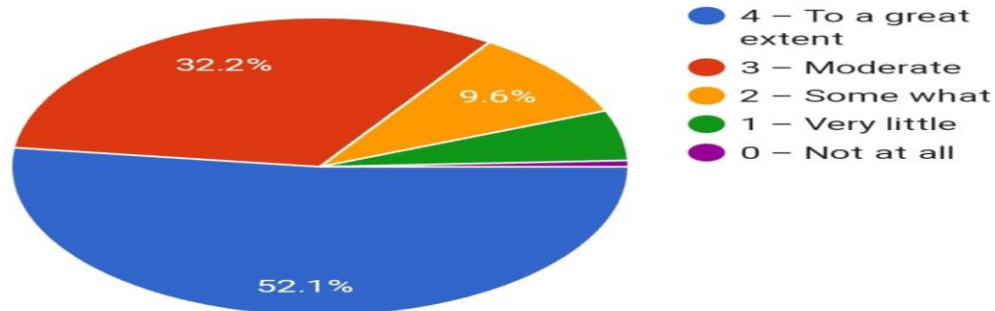

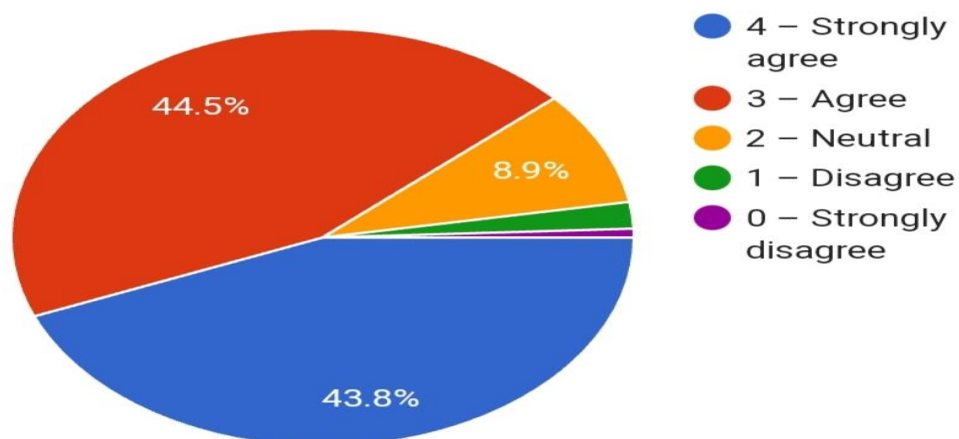

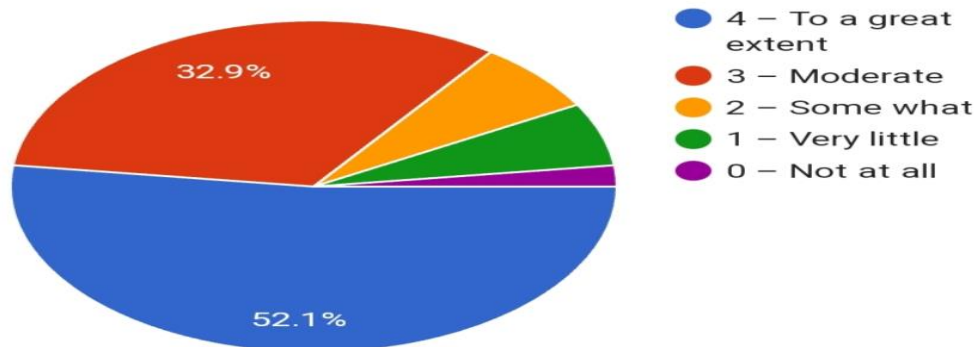

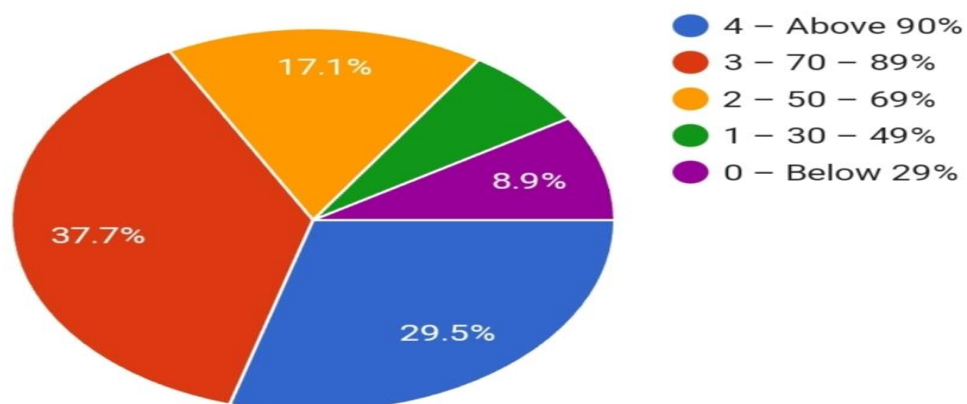

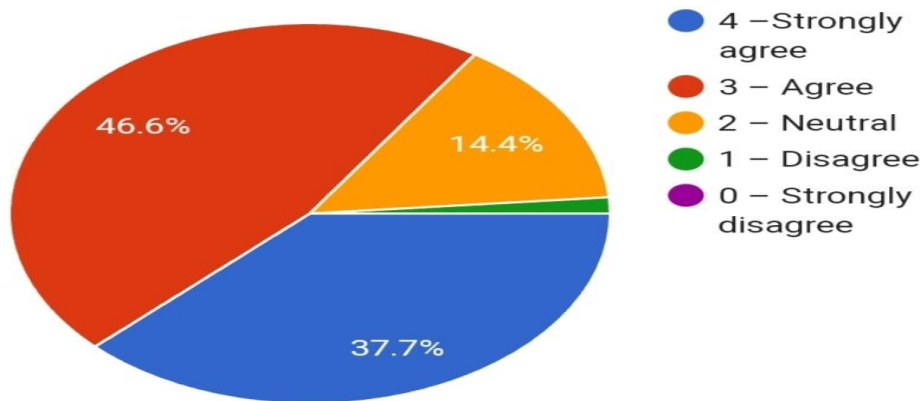

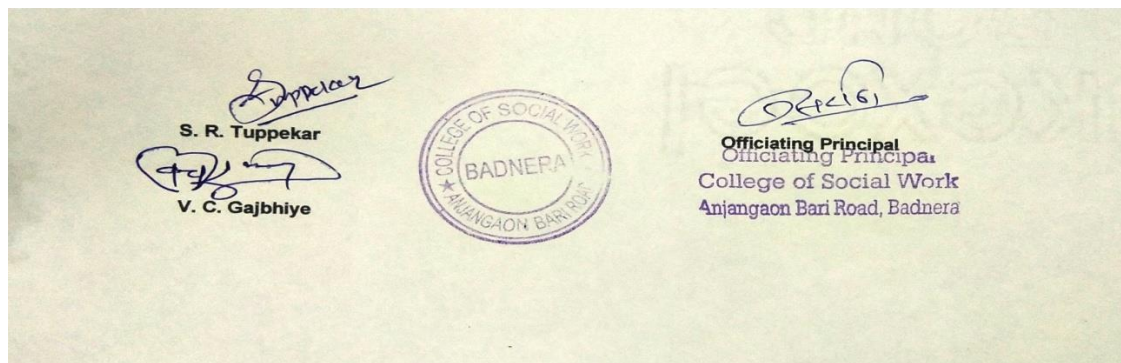

Report of Student Satisfaction Survey (2022-2023)

Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) is one of the Mandatory criteria set by NAAC. As per guideline of NAAC student satisfaction survey (SSS) was conducted in the college. Survey consists of 21 questions. The random sample size to conduct this survey was 146 (27%) of total 536 student. Data analysis of the survey was done and the inferences of the survey are as follows.

- A) Out of 146 (100%) most of the 97.9% students confirmed that this was the first time and only time they have answered this survey.
- B) Out of 146 (100%) students 76 (52.05%) students are in age group of 18 to 21 Years, 45 (30.82%) students are in age group of 22 to 25 Years, 11 (7.5%) students are in age group of 26 to 29 age group, 04 (2.7 %) students are in the age group of 30 to 33 age group, 02 (1.3 %) students are in the age group of 34 to 37 and 08 (5.4 %) students are in the age group of 38 and above age group
- C) Out of 146 (100%) students 39.7% students are Male and 60.3% students are Female.
- D) Out of 146 (100%) students 57.5% students are in BSW and 41.8% students are in MSW and 0.7% are studying in MA-Sociology.
- E) Out of 146 (100%) students participated in SSS are as follows- 6.8% students are currently studying in BSW-I, 30.8% are studying in BSW-II, 19.2 % are studying in BSW-III, 17.8% are in MSW-I, 24 % students are studying in MSW-II whereas 0.7% are in MA-I and 0.7% II year.

Questions regarding Teaching–Learning and Evaluation

- 8) 56.2% students said that the teaching and mentoring process in institution **Very Well** facilitates them in cognitive, social and emotional growth.

- 9) 56.8 % students **agreed** to the statement that the institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow.
- 10) 60.3% students said that teachers **every time** inform them about their expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes.
- 11) 58.9% students said that their mentor **every time** does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to them.
- 12) 62.3% students said that the teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications **every time**.
- 13) 61% students said that the teachers **fully** identify their strengths and encourage them with providing right level of challenges.
- 14) 59.6% students said that teachers are able to identify their weaknesses and help them to overcome them **every time**.
- 15) 42.5% students **strongly agreed** to the statement that the institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process.
- 16) 52.1% students said that the institute/ teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences **to a great extent**.
- 17) 44.5% students **agreed to the statement** that teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities.
- 18) 52.1% students said that efforts are made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make them ready for the world of work **to a great extent**.
- 19) 37.7% students said that **70-89 %** of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching.
