

8. Students have applied critical thinking skills within the context of professional social work practice.
9. Students have demonstrated the ability to use communication skills differentially across client populations, colleagues, and communities.
10. Students have demonstrated skills and tasks related to administration like planning, organizing, staffing, direction, and coordination, report writing, budgeting and also developed the professional attitude required in professional social work.
11. Students have demonstrated the ability to function within the structure of agency, organization and service delivery system and seek necessary organizational change.

13. Students have demonstrated the ability to understand and interpret both the history of the profession and social welfare system as part of the context for their practice.


